### **Deputies Arrest Three in Theft, Shots Fired Call at Marijuana Grow**

**Pueblo, CO:** Pueblo County Sheriff's Deputies quickly apprehended and arrested three people who burglarized a legal marijuana grow in east Pueblo County Wednesday morning.

Deputies arrested Brandon Lujan, 26; Daimon Lanckriet, 27 and Alissa Ramos, 21. Lujan was arrested for complicity, first-degree burglary, criminal mischief, theft and unlawful possession of a controlled substance. Lanckriet was arrested for first-degree burglary, attempted first-degree assault, theft and possession of a weapon by a previous offender. Ramos was arrested for complicity, first-degree burglary and theft. All three have been booked into the Pueblo County Jail.

Deputies responded to 2200 block of Hickory Avenue at about 9:45 a.m. on a robbery call after employees of Denco, a legal marijuana grow operation, reported they were robbed and then shot at as the suspects left the property in two separate vehicles. No one was injured in the shooting, however an employee suffered minor injuries after his vehicle was hit but a suspect vehicle as it drove from the area. The victim was taken to a local hospital and was treated and released.

When deputies arrived, they found the suspect vehicles – a 2007 Cadillac and a 2003 Ford Windstar – nearby after both were involved in separate accidents while attempting to leave the area. Deputies set up a perimeter around the area and immediately located and took into custody two men and a woman. Two handguns also were recovered. Deputies continued to search the area on foot and utilized a K-9 and a drone to look for possible additional suspects. Colorado State Patrol and Pueblo Police also assisted at the scene.

Sheriff's detectives later recovered another vehicle at a hotel in the city that is believed to have been involved in the incident. A search warrant is pending on that vehicle.

Denco employees estimated between \$45,000 to \$50,000 worth of marijuana product was missing from the business. No marijuana product has been recovered.
