### **COVID Vaccine Site Set to Administer Record 1,000 Vaccines on Thursday**

**Pueblo, CO:** Pueblo County has worked hard over the past 72 hours to streamline our mass vaccination clinic. All the while, county officials have been very vocal about our ability to vaccinate many more people if only doses are available. This afternoon, Pueblo Department of Health and Environment confirmed the highest number of doses to date in Pueblo County will be available tomorrow. Workers at the Pueblo Mall Clinic expect to vaccinate a record 1,000 residents aged 70-and-older on Thursday at the Unified Vaccination Clinic at the Pueblo Mall.

The clinic, which has been averaging about 700 vaccination daily since it opened Monday, received a huge boost in additional vaccines provided by Parkview Medical Center. The added doses will allow clinic staff to administer a milestone 1,000 vaccines, an important step for local officials to demonstrate our capability to distribute at a rate of over 200 persons an hour.

Pueblo County Sheriff Kirk M. Taylor said "Parkview understands firsthand the critical need we have in getting our 70-plus residents vaccinated in a timely manner. We appreciate their willingness to help us move forward to get this segment of our population vaccinated as quickly as possible."

The tremendous, coordinated response here in Pueblo is historic. PDPHE Director Randy Evetts sees entities like Parkview Medical Center making a difference. "I can't say enough about our partners here in Pueblo who continue to rise up and help us respond to this pandemic. We are receiving vaccine, staff, and other types of support from different organizations nearly every day."

All those receiving the vaccines at tomorrow's clinic will have previously registered through the website [pueblovaxnow.com](http://pueblovaxnow.com) or by calling 719-583-4444. Automated registration calls began at 4 p.m. and will continue until all 1,000 doses are assigned to our vulnerable population. Only those individuals who receive an appointment will get the vaccine. There are no walk-ups accepted at the clinic.
