Man Arrested After Brief Standoff Following Domestic Violence Incident

Pueblo, CO: The Pueblo County Sheriff's Office continues to investigate a domestic violence incident that led to a brief standoff with law enforcement at a home in the city of Pueblo and resulted in the peaceful arrest of 41-year-old man this morning.

An alert driver notified law enforcement after seeing a woman, who was a passenger in a truck that was traveling westbound on Highway 50, waving her hands and asking for help. The woman was able to get out of the moving truck in the 2000 block of E. 16th Street, while the driver stopped and got out of the vehicle and ran into a nearby residence.

Deputies learned the woman had been involved in a domestic violence incident with the male driver earlier in the morning at a home in the 300 block of First Street in Boone. The woman was reportedly taken against her will by the suspect identified as Daniel Montano, 41. The woman was transported to a local hospital where she was treated for injuries sustained in the incident.

Montano barricaded himself in the residence on E. 16th Street. The Pueblo Police SWAT team responded and assisted with getting Montano to surrender peacefully. Montano was arrested for second-degree kidnapping, obstruction of telephone service, restraining order violation, domestic violence, two counts of second-degree assault and two counts of revocation of bail bond. He was booked into the Pueblo County Jail. Montano recently had been released from jail for second-degree assault and domestic violence charge out of Denver with the same victim.
